Dear Parents,
This Leadership Spotlight is going to talk about working a Vision with thoughtful Action.
Sometimes in leadership you want to do something different. The first thing you need to do is pray about the change. Try this method the next time you want to put something forward:

1. Look above you: What does God expect of you? Will making this change match God's expectations?
2. Look ahead of you: What is the big picture? What will each leaf on the tree look like if you make the change? (How is each leader in the situation influenced?)
3. Look behind you: What have you learned or researched? Have you gotten the pulse on this idea from someone knowledgeable?
4. Look around you: What is happening to others in the situation. Is it good? What specifically, is the reality for each person involved that might not be leading, but they are involved in the "doing?"
5. Look within you: What do you feel about the change? Can you stand up strong for the decision and see good that comes from it? It it "God" good? That's the real test. Is it something God would support?
6. Look beside you: What resources are beside you? Have you gone to the people who are great resources to help with the change? Having "buy in" from the people beside you is important. Change does not come by trying to do something by yourself. It is always "we" in change. Not you, not just me...we is important.
7. Great positive change does not always take the majority.

As the primary educators of your children, parents and guardians are encouraged to review these materials ahead of time. Please review the lessons on your own to start these vital safety conversations at home. Two additional resources may be available to you for review through this location upon request: The Teaching Boundaries and Safety Guide, and The Lesson Leader Orientation and Certification Module. If you've been volunteering at the school recently - or in the not-too-distant past - you're probably halfway to clearance already - you may just need the specialized online coach's training.
